Fellow Members:

After a cold and snowy winter it's almost time for the 2025 golf season. The Spook Rock Men's Club enjoyed an exciting season in 2024 and we look forward to a great year in 2025! There continues to be tremendous interest in joining the Men's Club and I expect this year to be even better with some exciting new developments in the works. I hope all of our members had a positive experience last season and we hope to see everyone back this year. **Our annual in person meeting will take place Thursday, March 20th at 7pm in the Chalet at Spook Rock.** Please try to attend if possible.

The board is pleased to attach to this email the 2025 Membership Application, the Tournament Schedule, the Men's Club roster, tournament rules and Mid Week League application. We have simplified the Application Form for 2025. There will be a small increase in our membership fees for the 2025 season. Current resident members will see a \$10 increase, non resident members a \$20 increase and new members a \$30 increase. We want everyone to fill out the Application Form this year so we have up to date information for all our members. That means both existing members and new members.

I want to thank our Head Golf Professional Jim McCann for providing the Men's Club with his time and his support. Jim provides us with the tee times needed to get all of us on the golf course in a timely manner. We are looking forward to 2025 and working with Jim, Assistant Pro Chris Cohen and the rest of the staff to keep improving our Men's Club experience. Spook Rock continues to make course improvements since Troon management took over. You will continue to see Superintendent Burgess (Trapper) Van Dunk and his staff working hard to improve course conditions daily. Trapper is a proud Suffern High School and Penn State University graduate with a BS in Turfgrass Science. He has 18 years experience as a superintendent and has contributed his expertise to various golf courses in the Metropolitan area.

One of the exciting developments this season is we are increasing the prize money in our team and individual tournaments. Each tournament will now pay out in pro shop credit \$75pp for 1st place, \$50pp for 2nd place and \$25pp for 3rd place. It came to my attention last year that some members were using their pro shop credit for greens fees and range balls. This will be stopped. The Pro Shop has been informed to accept pro shop credit for merchandise and equipment only.

The Men's Club uses text messaging (including the GroupMe App) and email for communication and to send out important club and tournament information. This includes inclement weather notifications, "day of" rule changes, pairing changes, openings, etc. It is imperative that if you did not receive this letter by email, either we do not have your correct email address, or you have a SPAM filter blocking it. It is your responsibility to provide us with a valid account. It will be your loss not to be informed. Please carefully review your information on last year's roster (telephone number and email address) and let us know if any changes are needed.

Please review the 2025 Application form that is attached carefully. Early sign up is important for all existing members along with registration fees because of the number of members in the club and the waiting list to become a new member. Please have all fees paid by **April 15th** or risk being in jeopardy of losing your spot. You can pay by **Venmo (@Andy-Firestone-1)** or by check. **This is important: If you are paying using Venmo, to protect the Men's Club from any possible tax implications make sure before you hit "Pay" for the final time, the "Turn on for Purchases" button is to the left and gray so it sends as "Payment between Friends."** If you are paying by check please make the check out to **Spook Rock Golf Club**. The Men's Club will cover the costs of our legacy members (over 80 years old and a paying member for the past 10 years). Also to recognize the exceptional service the men's club receives from the pro shop staff, a \$10 pp year end gratuity is included in the annual dues. Please check the schedule carefully as some tournaments have moved to different dates. We played The Club Championship in September for the 1st time last season and it will remain there this year. Congratulations to our Club Champion Mike Leder for successfully defending his title! The Qualifying rounds will be played on September 6th and 7th. We will hold the match play portion on 2 successive weekends following the qualifying tournament. These dates are mandatory. If you qualify and are not able to play on those dates please inform the committee so we can give the next qualifier the chance to compete. Review the schedule for the dates of the match play portion of The Club Championship. Keep in mind playing in the qualifying rounds is still important since you can earn points for the interclub matches even if you cannot play in the playoffs. The Championship Flight will be a 36 Hole Final with 18 played on Saturday and 18 Sunday. The rest of the flights will be an 18 Hole Sunday Final. To guarantee we get two qualifying rounds completed in the event of inclement

weather, the rain date will be Saturday September 13th and match play will begin the next day and continue the following Saturday and Sunday.

We will once again have **4 flights for the Club Championship.** Last years' Champs will get a bye into the match-play portion for this year. The flights for the Club Championship will be determined based upon the **handicap revision the Sunday before the Qualifier**. The handicaps for the Governor's cup matches will lock based upon your effective handicap on the day you play your match. The handicap for flight placement for the Challenge and Friendship Cups will be determined based upon the **June 1st handicap revision**.

The first round of the Governor's Cup and the 1st and 2nd rounds of the Club Championship Qualifier **MUST** be played on the dates indicated on the schedule prior to sign up. In the event of a situation forcing cancellation of a particular date (rainout, course becomes unavailable, for example), the Tournament Committee will reschedule and set new dates. **Once again this year** we will not be allowing "side by side" playing of matches. If the only day you can schedule a match in the match play portion of the tournament is the day of another tournament you will not be allowed to participate in that week's tournament while playing your match.

The Governor's Cup is one of our most popular tournaments and I would like everyone to make an effort to complete your matches in a timely manner. My goal is to have all matches in all flights completed by the end of July. That gives us two and a half months after the initial matches to complete 3 matches in each flight. The Competition Committee will be contacting the winners of each match to make sure you are scheduling your next match ASAP. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter. The Tournament Committee reserves the right to change dates due to unforeseen circumstances (which don't include personal inconvenience), but absent those, these are hard and fast dates for matches.

One of the season's most popular tournaments The Ryder Cup will be open to any 2 man teams that would like to participate as long as you meet the tournament guidelines. Some teams may receive a 1st round bye based on the draw. We plan on playing the Round of 32 matches on the weekend of July 19-20. We are still finalizing details and will have more information soon. If you advance please try your best to schedule your matches ASAP so we can complete this tournament in a reasonable timeframe.

Head Professional Jim McCann and his staff will be hosting another Member Guest Weekend this June. The tournament has been very successful in past seasons and enjoyed by all who participated. The 3-day member guest event will be held June 27-29th. The event will feature 9 holes of practice golf on Friday evening, matches over 27 holes on Saturday and 18 holes on Sunday. Each flight will consist of six 2-man teams playing 9 holes of match play against each team in their flight. There will be meals with an open bar included. Keep an eye out for emails as we get closer to the date.

The Spook Rock **Member-Guest** Tournament will be held on Saturday October 4th. We had another successful tournament last year and raised money for the Men's Club support of Junior Golf. The proceeds are used to sponsor scholarships for the local school golf teams and we are now contributing golf equipment to them as well. Please help support the event. We hope more members will participate and bring guests. If you have a suggestion to improve the day's event, please share it with us. Our hope is to make this day a feel-good day about our club and our course. It gives the members a valuable opportunity to entertain a business associate, friend or family member. Please support it. Please let us know if you want to be part of the **Member-Guest** committee. We would be happy to have any help we can, making arrangements, raising money, etc.

We have scheduled our 2025 team matches against the Rotella and Patriot Hills Golf Clubs. The dates have been confirmed. We will have 11 qualifying event rounds to make the Rotella Challenge Cup match, noted with ******** on the schedule, and 6 noted with **for** the Patriot Hills Friendship Cup match. The size of the teams may be changing as well as the cost to play. We will announce it as soon as we know. Key tournaments have a weighted value of points. In the event a qualifying tournament is canceled because of weather or similar reasons, every effort will be made to reschedule, however we all will have to accept the results of the events which are completed if we cannot reschedule.

Because we have 3 flights for the team matches with Rotella/Patriot and 4 flights for the Club Championship we do have some players who are in the A flight for the interclub matches and B flight for the Club Championship. All A flight players will have to play the same tees as everyone else in their flight to accumulate points. For example, If you are an A flight player for the Challenge Cup but a B flight player for the Club Championship qualifier you will not be eligible for Challenge Cup points unless you play in the A flight. You can play the Club Championship in the B flight but you will not receive Challenge Cup points. This goes for any tournament where the A flight players play the Blue tees.

2025 Men's Club Tournament Requirements

In our continuing effort to make our tournaments fair for all we will require the following:

- All members must have active and updated handicaps.
- For all tournaments and league scores please hand your scorecard to the pro shop after you have completed your round and they will post your scores. What that means is, you turn in the printed scorecard we provide and we will post all scores.
- If you miss your tee time or sign an incorrect scorecard you will be DQ'd from the tournament. This will be enforced to protect the field. Before you leave the course make sure all scores and information is correct.
- GHIN rules require ALL scores to be posted. That includes only playing nine holes. If you play 10-17 holes you must post your score using the hole-by-hole method. This allows the use of expected score for a hole not played. This also includes match play rounds (Ex: Governor's Cup, Club Championship, Ryder Cup). When you make your tee time with the pro shop for your match play round let them know you are playing a match so we can give you an official scorecard. Whether you have an official scorecard or not the round must be posted. The only exceptions are Scramble and Shamble type events where you don't play your own ball, or if your round does not follow the prescribed USGA rules of golf. Please adhere to the rules. If you have any questions regarding posting scores, please see Dave Singleton, Jeff Reissman or one of the officers. If we know someone is not posting scores, or manipulating scores, the handicap chair will take the appropriate action.

The club will use handicapping by the USGA and MGA. In addition, for the first time last year we used Cap Patrol which is a handicap management system featured in Golf Digest and currently being used by over 1100 clubs nationwide. We will be using Cap Patrol again this season. Some of Cap Patrol's features include:

-A player's potential or ability in recent play and tournament rounds

Variance in Home vs Away roundsThe disparity in casual vs competitive playPlacement in tournaments/events

You can go to **cappatrol.com** to learn more about all of their features.

Jeff Reissman will be the Rules Chairman. We also are enclosing the club tournament rules with this mailing.

General Tournament Policy/Sign Up Rules

The Men's club has adopted the "Play it Forward" concept promoted by the USGA. We encourage our members to play the tournament from the gold tees when their combined age and handicap give them the opportunity to do so. Keep in mind your handicap will be adjusted accordingly, and the scores need to be posted as played from the gold tees. When you sign up please indicate that you elect to play from the gold tees, so the handicaps on the tournament card can be calculated. To be eligible to play the Gold Tees your Age+Handicap must equal 83 or higher. All of the weekly tournaments that are handicap tournaments including The President's Cup and Governor's Cup can be played from the Gold Tees. The Met/Net qualifier must be played from the White tees.

One of the most critical issues for an organization to run smoothly is communication. Dave Singleton, Brian Pickell and Tom Demont circulate email blasts for tournament sign ups, inclement weather rules, pairings and last-minute tournament openings. **Remember if the course is open we play the scheduled tournament.** Make sure we have a current email address, and you read our emails regularly. You can sign up for tournaments electronically using Golf Genius through the email you receive from Dave Singleton, Brian Pickell or Tom Demont. Doing this keeps everything much simpler for everyone involved. It is your responsibility to sign up for tournaments. The officers spend a lot of time and effort to form schedules, list pairings, and post future tournaments and outings so please don't mess it up for everyone else. Pay attention to the mailings and the schedule in advance. Doing this will help keep the tournaments fair for everyone.

As far as tee time requests we try to honor them when possible. We have a lot of members in the club so generally your tee time will be between 8am and 12:30pm. Please do not request a tee time if there is no reason involved (wedding, family event, etc.) We will NOT be honoring requests for no reason. Our goal is to spread the tee times around as fairly as possible between all our members.

The No Show Policy is still in effect. It allows the guilty player to pay a \$40 fine to avoid suspension. If you do not show up for your tee time and do not have a valid reason you have hurt the other members of your tournament team. Also if you walk off the course during a round because you are playing badly that also hurts your team and you will be fined the same \$40. The committee can remove you from future tournaments if the fine is not paid.

Once again we will have a Competition Committee to oversee disputes and rules infractions. The committee will consist of Dave Singleton, John Leonard, and Harold Spector. The job of the committee is to investigate the circumstances of the infraction and make a final ruling of matters brought to their attention by the membership for not following the rules of golf.

The procedure will be as follows, and needs to be adhered to:

The complainant needs to discuss his complaint with the club member who he notes may have violated a rule **first.** If he witnessed the act, those involved discuss the matter before the scores are turned in, and really before they move on to the next hole in case a second ball needs to be played. If it is a global issue and not from a round of golf, before the complainant comes to the committee with the complaint, the member must discuss the matter with the alleged, and perhaps the matter can be closed. It is important that the complaint be known by both parties, and possibly through discovery of the rules or circumstances of the matter it can be resolved by both parties agreeing with the score and scorecard before it is signed and turned in. This is the gentlemanly way it should be handled. Hopefully all the members of the foursome will agree and participate. If the matter is not closed then it needs to be brought to the attention of the committee.

Play in the bunkers will remain the same this year. The board has agreed it is in the best interest of competition that we are able to rake and get 6 inches relief no closer to the hole in sand traps for all tournaments. Everywhere else on the course we will play the ball as it lies unless otherwise directed before play begins.

<u>**Pace-Of-Play</u>** is discussed every year. Keeping the course moving makes the game more enjoyable. Try and play your round in 4 hours. In no case should a group play in more than $4\frac{1}{2}$ hours. This starts at the First Tee, you must check-in and be ready to tee off 15 minutes before your tee time. Keep pace with the group in front. Pay attention to the others in your foursome and help them play efficiently. If you are the player away, get ready to take your next shot **before** starting a conversation.</u>

Don't forget the <u>Hole-In-One Pool</u> when paying your dues. We have had a winner of the Hole-in-One pool each of the last four years. Congratulations to John Barry for winning last year's Hole-in-One money. Since we had a winner last season the prize fund starts at \$0. The fee is \$20 pp to participate so we can fund the pool. All Men's Club Tournaments will be

Hole-in-One tournaments, except if otherwise noted on the schedule. Also, if you start the day playing a match play event (Governor's Cup, Club Championship) all Hole-in-Ones will count even if the match is over. The pool will be split with all those making a qualifying Hole-in-One during the 2024 tournament season. It is NOT a first in payout, it runs the entire season. Please read the enclosed tournament policy for additional information. The money will be paid at the awards breakfast if there is a winner.

NOTICE Thursday Night League

ALL Thursday night league money must be paid prior to the start of the league. You can pay at the meeting, mail it in or Venmo Andy Firestone (use above address). Dave Singleton continues to run the league. If you haven't paid for the league by **April 15**, you will **lose** your spot. There is a lot of demand to get into the league. Dave will announce the format at the annual meeting.

I want to recognize and thank our Board members for the time and effort they put in to plan, coordinate, and schedule events all with the goal of improving our golfing experience. That being said, the real strength of our club comes through our members. Spook Rock is a place where lifelong friendships and good memories are made every season, and because of that our membership continues to grow every year. Our goal is to have every individual play with as many members as possible during the season to get the full experience of our club. As a member you will make new friends every year. One of my main goals each season is to continue the tradition of great golf, camaraderie and building relationships. I would like to hear your thoughts during the year about our events and tournaments that we schedule and any ideas you may have for improvements. I'm available at the course, by email or text to listen to what you have to say.
